The purpose of this course is to prepare students to use the Greek language for biblical exegesis.

Objectives:

1. To experience the New Testament in its original language.
2. To acquire a basic vocabulary consisting of words appearing frequently in the NT
3. To learn the fundamentals of Greek grammar
4. To gain a basic knowledge of text criticism
5. To become familiar with resources for translation and exegesis.
